During 1988, when Berlin was the Cultural Capital of Europe, a group of musicians organized a series of concerts under the topic 'Sounds of Desert'. All concerts took place at a particular location, The Berlin Planetarium. This impressive hall with its extraordinary acoustics has been a unique challenge for the musicians of the band DIE ELEFANTEN to create an intense sound with percussive aspects. Their music was composed under the title 'Wasserwüste' [Watery Desert].

The knowledge that all life is based on the cyclic strength of water - a vulnerable

balance of nature - is the background of the music. An amplification which was set up especially for this concert, made it possible to make the sound rotate which along with optical effects intensified the impression of the music.

The CD 'Wasserwüste' was live recorded during the concert on June 8th 1988.
